Home Learning



COVID-19 Reminders



- ❖ Please ensure that you are wearing a mask at school drop offs and pick up times (unless you are exempt)
- ❖ Use the one-way system into school for drop off and pick up times each day. We are asking that only **one adult per family** drops their child into school via the green gate.
- ❖ Limit conversations at the classroom doors with your child's class teacher. Please contact the school office and the teacher will phone you back later that day in order to limit excess face to face interactions for staff.
- ❖ If your child is showing signs of illness, they should not be in school.
- ❖ If your child shows symptoms during the school day, you will be asked to come and collect your child as quickly as possible and follow the Government guidance regarding testing.
- ❖ If you are self-isolating, then please contact the school office so we can organise remote learning for your child if they are well enough to complete.
- ❖ If you're a member of a household, childcare bubble or support bubble of staff or a pupil you can get a twice-weekly test:
 - ❖ at a local test site (Home testing kits are not available from these sites at the moment)
 - ❖ by collecting a home test kit from a test site (Only certain sites - please check the map)
 - ❖ by ordering a home test kit online (Ordering online for home delivery is available to people not able to collect)
